The Farjam Foundation, based in Dubai, is a centre for preservation and promotion of the arts at large. The Farjam Foundation's mission is to serve art enthusiasts, scholars and curators in order to bridge cross-cultural barriers through educational and artistic means. In 2013, the evolution of The Farjam Collection into The Farjam Foundation signified a greater focus on the link between art and philanthropy.

At the core of the Foundation's work lies The Farjam Collection; one of the world's foremost privately owned art collections encompassing Islamic, Middle Eastern and Western art. Its vast Islamic section spans the entire history of Islam, comprising a multitude of art forms from manuscripts on science, poetry and mathematics to textiles, metal works, paintings, sculptures, lacquers and fine carpets. Uniquely, an important portion of The Farjam Collection is devoted to modern and contemporary art from the Middle East, celebrating leading artists such as Abbas Kiarostami, Shirin Neshat and Farhad Moshiri from Iran, Susan Hefuna, Monir Fatmi and Abdul Nasser Gahrem from its Arab section, and Gulay Semercioglu, Devrim Erbil and Bahar Oganer from Turkey. The Farjam Collection equally takes pride in its distinguished and extensive selection of international art, with a selection of works that includes principal figures of Modern art history such as Pablo Picasso, Willem de Kooning, Alexander Calder and Andy Warhol, alongside masters of Contemporary art such as Anselm Kiefer, Jeff Koons and Andreas Gursky. The Farjam Foundation's flagship DIFC space houses a series of alternating thematic exhibitions made available to the public in order to showcase the Collection's works and share them with a wider audience.

The Farjam Foundation works with top universities and educational institutions hosting tours and specialized programmes for young scholars. Our initiatives and collaborations enhance a broader understanding of cultural differences through a curriculum of cultural and artistic programmes promoting tolerance and dialogue between nations. The Foundation has worked with the United Nation's World Food Programme as well as the Dubai Cares Foundation. The Farjam Foundation's principal objective is to connect the world through cultural, intellectual, and educational experiences.

DAISUKE OHBA

Daisuke Ohba is a Japanese artist based in Tokyo, known for his large-scale abstract and landscape paintings and considered to be one of the most prominent up-and-coming artists today. He was born in Shizuoka in 1981 and received his MFA from Tokyo National University of Fine Arts and Music. In 2004 he was awarded the Shell Art Prize and has been extensively displaying his artworks in national and international exhibitions. Nature's Duet exhibits a series of works from this first solo exhibition entitled The Light Field, which was held in Tokyo in 2009.

Ohba's works in Nature's Duet operate on two principal levels, the first being the landscape he depicts of woodland setting, and the second being the ways in which he pours an enchanting pool of light across his canvas, giving the whole piece an effect similar to that of stained glass with illuminating rays filtering through. The technique devised to achieve this impact is his skillful use of opalescent acrylic pearl paint which allows him to create ever changing illusions of light with shifting colours, bringing his artworks to life and giving them a sense of movement as the onlookers migrate through the space they are displayed in. Ohba pushes the boundaries of his representations of light by extending the power of his artwork beyond the physical limitations of the canvas and allowing the viewer to feel apart of the experience, becoming enveloped in the atmosphere of the piece. Each individual develops a unique relationship with Ohba's creations, for external elements such as natural light and the viewer's line of sight are carefully considered in his landscape depictions. The interplay between the artwork, viewer and environment is what leads Ohba to define his creations as 'installations in painting form'. The piece shifts in appearance according to the angle the onlooker chooses or the natural light of the moment of observation. In his own words, 'The work adapts to circumstances, rather than controls them'. The opalescent paint engulfs the space in which the works are presented in an illusion of light, emanating splendour. Although at first glance the viewer sees forests and trees, the staggering effect woven by Ohba is the dazzling illumination that captures observer and makes him or her feel as though they too were engulfed in a natural world of the sublime and of shimmering light that the artist has recreated. It is this very effect that led Daisuke Ohba to entitle his first solo exhibition 'The Light Field'.

JORGE MAYET

Ature's Duet presents a selection of sculptures and paintings from Cuban refugee artist *Jorge Mayet* whose works, which are strongly influenced by his Caribbean roots, are becoming increasingly renowned on an international scale. Born in Cuba in 1962, Mayet focused primarily on painting at the beginning of his career, but gradually moved on to concentrate on creating sculptures and installations. His artworks have been showcased extensively around the world, with exhibitions in venues such as the Museum of Arts and Design in New York and a current collection in the Saatchi Museum in London. Mayet lives and works in Mallorca, Spain.

Nature is a resounding theme amongst Mayet's artworks, but far from aiming to capture only its contemplative beauty, his representations of landscapes also seek to evoke an underlying internal conflict he feels as a consequence of his displacement from his homeland. The artworks produced respond to a need to recreate a body of memories, the artist's own memories, turning his pieces into a perceptible poem of transcending emotions capturing his sentiments of exile and disharmony. Mayet has become particularly well known globally for his unique and ingenious sculptural representations. His skillfully crafted installations of uprooted trees hanging in mid air are a metaphor for his own life experience: feelings of being suspended between his country of birth and the country he has since adopted as home. These conflicting emotions in perpetual evolution attach a new facet to the intricately constructed floating representations. Mayet creates his works, which often take the shape of imaginary trees as well as other objects from the natural world, with a unique combination of electrical wire, paper, acrylics and fabric. So skillfully engineered are his installations and so life like is the final result that it is difficult for the onlooker to differentiate them from a miniature version of reality. The artist captures nature's landscape to perfection, all the while depicting an extra dimension rich in symbolism that alludes to a life filled with loss, confusion and loneliness.






